A Magical Beginning in the AV Hall



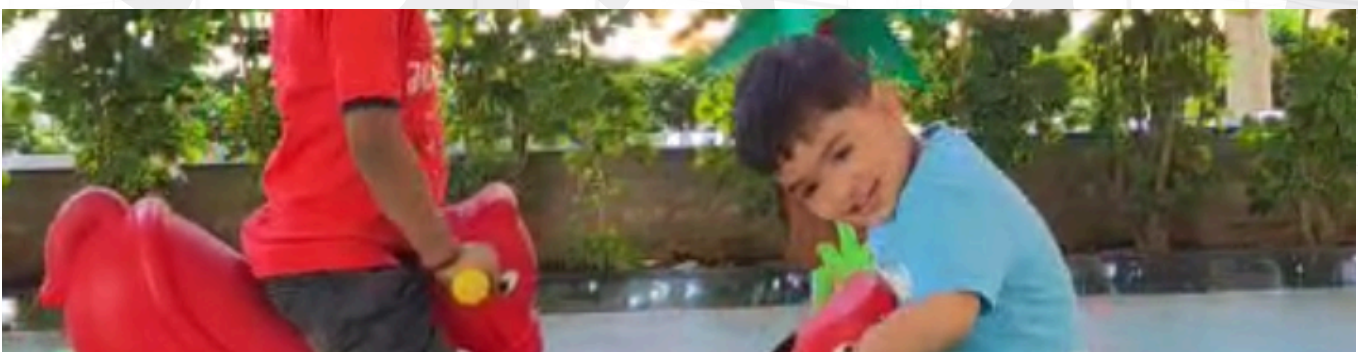

Little Moments that Spoke Volumes

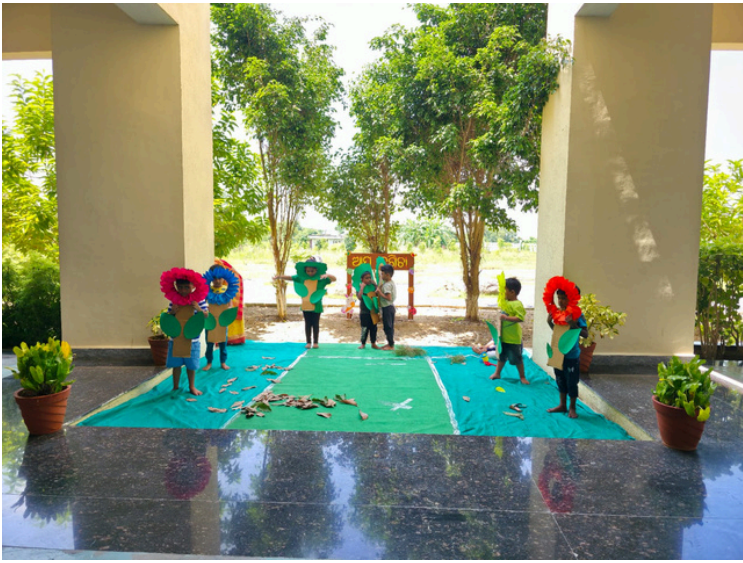

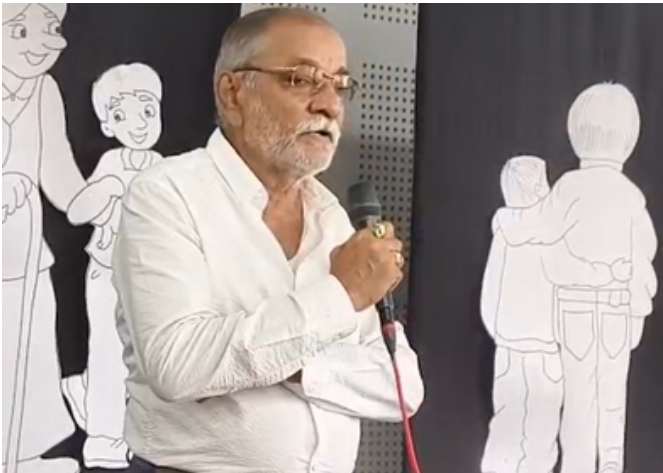
